The Entire Village Board led the assembly in the salute to the flag.

The invocation was delivered by Reverend Walter Brightman.

Mayor's Report – (Mayor Speech)

Welcome to our first organization meeting on this brisk December 6, 2010 evening. As I address members of the community, leaders, friends and families, I would be remiss to open this session without giving a big "thank you" to my back-up team and to all my supporters. Especially the Board of Trustees and thanks to Reverend Walter Brightman my long time friend.

This year has been a great year, not only for me, but for all Village residents. As elected officials we often pledge to do what's best for our community. Keeping our promises is one thing, focused and to deliver is a better thing. I was fortunate to have God on my side and the Board of Trustees to help me fulfill my promises to you. My obligation as a public servant is to make sure to accomplish all the goals and promises that were made during the course of my campaign.

In December 7, 2009 when I took oath of office I pledged to you that I would serve you to the best of my ability. I was elected by you and I will only serve you. As you know the Village of Spring Valley is very diverse with forty-two ethnic groups, each group has different needs, and I am sensitive to all those needs.

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The task you entrusted me with requires experience, passion and commitment. The experience that I have gained over many years makes it easier for me to tackle some of the complex issues our Village is facing on a daily basis; such as, high property tax, combating crimes, the need for low income housing, and the opening of Union Road, “people are frustrated”.

Since taking office, my administration has followed three guiding principles: Focus on economic development opportunities, improving the quality of life and demand accountability in Village Hall. I take that as a strong mandate from the citizens of Spring Valley to put the Village on a firm business-like footing.

Let’s highlight some of the accomplishments we have made for the first year, just bear with me.

Budget: *The first issue we dealt with was the 2010/2011 budget. I am pleased to say, despite doomsday predictions, that it was “Impossible”. My colleagues and I on the Village Board came together to deliver the first “Zero Tax Increase budget in decades”. Residents have benefited for the first time in the history of the Village of Spring Valley, “a zero tax rate”. The tax rates have been consistently going up under the maximum levy allowed by the State. I worked diligently with the Assessor and the Treasury to keep our tax base strong and encourage business to remain in Spring Valley, to reinvest, which provided jobs for our Village residents. The most important aspect of saving is to refinance some of the existing bonds that have been facing the Village for years. This has translated to a saving of \$117,000 from June 2010 to present. “I am proud our Bond Rating went up from A3 to A1”.*

The Union Road: *For years people have been complaining about how difficult and dangerous the Union Road has become and the liability imposed to the Village and the County. As I promised you when elected, I would try my best to open Union Road. I called a meeting to meet with County elected officials, “I did just that”. On January 26th, other elected officials and I met with the County Executive, Scott Vanderhoff, along with the late Legislator William “Bill” Darden, Ilan Schoenberger, Harriet Cornell. I raised my concerns about the bridge and made it very clear that it was overdue with the presence of Trustee Delhomme, Trustee Gross and others. The Village Board and I secured \$800,000 to complete the project and open Union Road, after two years of dangerous detours.*

Section and Community Development: *In 2008 the Department of Section 8 underwent a lot of scrutiny by the Department of Housing and Urban Development as well as the Attorney General’s office. As the Deputy Mayor I took the lead scheduling meetings on a weekly basis and came up with a corrective action plan to make sure each finding was corrected. I met with the staff on a weekly basis with emphasis to meet HUD rules and regulations on a timely fashion. Furthermore, this administration consolidated the Section 8 Office and Community Development to form one department. This was done to preserve both offices and as a cost savings for the Village. I am also proud to say once again that the Section 8 Office and Community Development will remain here to continue their services to the community. The past year has seen a great deal of activity in the Department of Housing and Community Development. Numerous grants were received from December 7, 2009 and the present time as follows:*

- a) \$200,000 – CDBG funding for Kennedy Park
- b) \$106,000 – CDBG funding for Public Service projects for Spring Valley community based agencies
- c) \$156,727 – Weed and Seed – Year 2 (US Dept. of Justice). This is a police and community partnership to weed out and prevent crime
- d) \$9,643 – Records management Grant – Files in the Village Clerk’s office will be microfilmed for greater efficiency
- e) \$236,838 – Babbin Court Playground

The Spring Valley Police Department: *is one of the finest Police Departments in Rockland County, in fact, in the State of New York. They tirelessly continue to solve crime and have obtained hundreds of dollars from the forfeitures assets and grants which include, but not limited to Weed and Seed, JAG, Buckle up Seatbelts, Traffic Enforcement, DWI, that total is close to \$500,000. Recently an arrest of 47 people made in collaboration with other town and villages,*

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for selling drugs and possession of the same. The Police Department is very firm with actions of domestic violence and crime rates. The list goes on and on. Under the leadership of Chief Paul Modica, the Village of Spring Valley Police Department has reduced violent crime over 36% for the past year.

The Department of Public Works: *has always done a great job with snow removal, leaf pickup, street maintenance and trash removal which are standard services. However, as your Mayor my commitment to you is to provide services with “services” being the key to participate in a special training program to educate, train and inform employees how to provide services and interact with concerned residents. It is not just enough for us to provide these services. Each Village employee needs to know that we are employed or appointed to “serve” the residents. We must form a partnership with the residents, because they are our eyes and ears. I always say, I was elected by the people I only serve the people, and I will serve them to the best of my ability and with a smile, of course.*

Village Clerk’s Office: *Under my leadership I brought the most knowledgeable and finest Clerk to the Village, Mrs. Sherry Scott, to help straighten up the Clerk’s Office. First, we worked on the completion of payroll recertification from June 2009 to present, completed all Village Board meeting minutes, brought all the files and documents in the personnel office, update PTIs and I-9 forms which are required by law, completed various Bond Resolutions including supporting documents, made sure all forms and papers in files and all our code books are updated. We also registered more than 450 taxi cabs in the Village of Spring Valley which resulted in revenue close to \$120,000 and we gave over 550 Certificates, Proclamations and DSA Awards to the community. Thank you Sherry.*

Under the Law Office: *This year alone we have passed 13 new laws and revamped some of the old ones which have been approved by the Village Board and sent to the State. We also worked with the Building Department and Justice Court to resolve open building code violations. Entered into 35 Civil Compromises which brought in over \$8,000.00. Negotiated thousands of suspended traffic infractions to successful result. Settled PBA union contract which was on the verge of interest arbitration. Settled four outstanding grievances between the Village and PBA. Settled more than 14 certiorari tax cases.*

The Urban Renewal: *The Urban Renewal project (Site IV) adjacent to the Senior Citizen which is Site Three; stalled for a number of years due to the economic downfall. Since taking office I worked diligently with the developer of Site IV to reconfigure plans, close financial gaps and obtain permits and approvals so the project could move forward. Tonight, I am pleased to say that on December 16th, if weather permits, CPC and the Village of Spring Valley will have the groundbreaking to construct 54 affordable housing units.*

Justice Court: *1996 to 2008 the Justice Court was in disarray after receiving the report from the State Comptroller’s office. I took the liberty as the Deputy Mayor to bring on board a new person to straighten up all the backlogs and to reconcile the books. Today, I am proud to say the Spring Valley Justice Court is one of the most efficient Courts in Rockland County. The State Comptroller and the supervising Judge, Hon. Charles Apotheker, complimented the Spring Valley Court on its hard work. This Court is currently updated with all the reports. From December 7, 2009 when I took office to present the backlog is tremendously decreased and still working on the remainder. This year alone the Spring Valley Justice Court was rewarded two grants. The first one is a \$49,605 for Court Training and Solutions for all the personnel to combat Domestic Violence. With the Supervision of Justice Alan Simon, Justice Christine Theodore and Justice David Fried the Department is running effectively and efficiently as always.*

Parks and Recreation: *The Department of Parks and Recreation is eagerly awaiting the completion of its new building which will provide new space for an array of new programs and activities for our residents. Plans are in motion to offer physical education, arts and crafts, after school and weekend programs. Memorial Park has seen recent improvement and upgrades.*

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Village on the Green is being enjoyed by our residents. Two new facilities have been planned and funded Babbin Court Park and Kennedy Park.

Future Plans: A Community Center, Post Office Square, Site IV 55 Affordable Housing for Families

Once again, I thank you and thank you to the Board of Trustees. We have done so many things and I could not have done it without the Board. We are not only serving the people, we are leaving a legacy. Just do the right thing as a Board. Thank you and God Bless!
