I have been living in this house for forty-eight years. Many years ago the Village decided to put drains in the back of my house. They closed up a brook that ran through the development and they hooked up drains that ran across my back yard, my neighbor's back yard and was suppose to hook up to where the stream once was. I am constantly flooded. My property is down about a foot and a half in the back, I might be losing my trees because all of the roots are exposed. I have pictures of the latest flood that I would like to show you (Ms. Trubitz gives the pictures to the Board). I don't know what the Village is planning to do about it. Before you put the drains in we never had a problem with our yard, it was flat, it was level and now it's a hill. Every time it rains all my neighbors water collects on my property. That water over there is about two and one half feet deep (referring to a picture). That's my first problem. The second problem is the total lack of respect for the Village Ordinances in my neighborhood. I have been fighting this problem for six years. My mother before she died two years ago was fighting this problem. The garbage pails, the recycle bins everything is curb side 365 days a year. We constantly call the Building Department and Jesse is great and Walter is great, even Manny, but apparently nothing is done. Either these people are just getting, oh please bring it in or they are not being told. If they are going before the court and the court just slaps their hands and tell them just don't do it again, it means nothing. On 5 Stysly somehow the Village approved a gentleman there who live there, has a pet shop, and you approved him putting in a trailer where he can raise his birds on his driveway. Raising his birds on his driveway means his car cannot get in the driveway, his rear wheels are always out in the street, and he's got his garbage pails out. These pictures that I am going to give you were taken last Saturday afternoon. Garbage pick-up was Thursday and it wasn't schedule again until Monday. I don't care about Chavez because they have all day Friday and Thursday night to take them in and God bless them they all have a least eight to ten children and I love them dearly, but I have to abide by the rules and so should they. The Rabbi's house, number 10 Youmans, she is one of the worst offenders. She 's got about six pails out, they are out there constantly. These are just pictures that I want to submit, but this is what I have to live with. I abide by the rules. I'm sixty-five years old, I get my garbage out, I take it back, I take my recyclables in and out and how the Village can allow this to happen and I am telling you that it has been at least six years that we have begged and called and pleaded to this Village to just enforce the ordinances. At one point I came in and got copies of all the Village Ordinances and on my own I put them in everybody's mail box and they ignored it anyway. I use to go around my neighborhood and be part of Keep Rockland Beautiful, I use to buy flowers with my own money and plant them on people's property, but what for? The Village downtown and whatever you are trying to do in other places, God Bless You, but if you can't keep one little neighborhood clean and make these people follow the rules, then I don't understand why I just don't pack up and do what everyone else has done and move. They don't break up their boxes. I break up my boxes so the garbage men that we are paying for have to spend five-ten minutes at each house because the boxes are just piled up. The boxes don't go out on Wednesdays like they're suppose to, they go out all week long. Now, either there are rules or there are no rules. So, I am asking you, please finally, before I die, my mother did not live to see this development cleaned up, before I die, maybe, please do something.

Before we move on the main motion, I would like to make my statement. I was very pleased with the Board of Trustees. When we first started with the budget, we started with a 23% tax increase. So, for the last two weeks I have been working with the Treasury's office to see what we can do. So, we finally came up with (inaudible). Last night we had our Workshop and with the help of Trustee Delhomme, Deputy Mayor Desmaret and Trustee Leon, of course, Trustee Gross, we came up with 5.8%. The reason for that is that we have to zero out all of the demands that the departments were requesting. Yes, we would love to honor all of the demands, but however, the economy downfall of the Country does not permit us to do so. Therefore; we have to honor the State mandates, which is the State retirement going up to 46%, the Police and Fire is 17.6% and also we have a couple (inaudible), it a whopping 27.1% up. Also we have a dental insurance and life it is 1.2%, and unemployment insurance which is 47.1%, hospitalization was at 12% and we narrowed it (inaudible) 9.4%. So that means that compared to 2010/2011 which was at \$2.28 million, now we have to come up with \$1.699 million to cover some of the other budget we have to use \$1.0 million to come up with this (inaudible). Since Chief Modica is in the room, I would like to extend my thanks to you Chief Modica because you were very helpful to the Board last night. Unfortunately, we came up with some minor costs in the overtime. I think everybody was concerned about the overtime, however; all the members of the Board would like to help in the hiring. Like we said last night, yes, we are going to make promises, we are going to move forward. I am going to say that to the public, we are going to take two guys and we are going to request for one of the local guys to be on board. We are concerned about the community and we know that the Police Department has been doing a wonderful job and we thank you so very much.

Trustee Delhomme

It is not an easy thing to do. Those of you who have not ever done a municipal budget, I have been doing this for a long time. The Departments have needs, and like the Mayor has said things have gone up. There is no choice. Some things we have no control over. We cannot touch them, they are mandated by the State. The requirement of the Trustees must vote for them. But, once you start the budget at 23% tax high (inaudible) come down to 5.80%, this is not an easy thing to do. This is the first time, in my history as a Trustee, we have truly discussed the budget. Although, we wanted it to be much lower, we want 2.5%. When I look at the whole thing, which I spoke to my colleagues, we are concerned about raising the taxes 5.80%, but if the Trustees do not give services, we need the services, you could cut the budget if you do not give services. If this budget passes tonight, bear in mind that we started at 23% tax high. If you want the first budget that was presented to by the Department Heads, if you look at the first one we would not be able to provide services.

Be it enacted by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Spring Valley, County of Rockland, State of New York that the code of the Village of Spring Valley is hereby amended by adding Chapter 200.

Purpose and Findings

The Village Board of Trustees finds that Salvia divinorum, also known as “Diviner’s Sage” or “Maria Pastora,” “Sage of the Seers,” “The Key,” “Purple Salvia,” “Purple Haze,” or “Sally S,” is a powerful psychoactive herb which can be smoked or chewed to produce hallucinogenic effect or visionary states. The Board further finds and determines that Salvia divinorum is native to the area of southern Mexico and has historically been used for its medicinal properties. In recent years, with the help of the Internet, the leaves of Salvia divinorum, or the entire plant, have become available in the United States. The Board further finds and determines that recent media reports have uncovered that Salvia divinorum is being abused by individuals, especially teenage children, in order to “self medicate” for depression. The long term effects of Salvia divinorum are unknown, but it has been shown to cause dysphoria in humans, which in the context of an underlying mood disorder, indicates a heightened risk of suicide. Therefore, the purpose of this law is to prohibit the possession and/or sale of Salvia divinorum in the Village of Spring Valley.

CHAPTER 200 Possession and Sale of Salvia Divinorum

SECTION 1. Definitions

As used in this law, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

SALVIA DIVINORUM- the herb commonly known as “Diviner’s Sage,” “Maria Pastora.”, “Sage of the Seers,” “The Key,” “Purple Salvia,” “Purple Haze,” or “Sally S,” whether sold as a whole plant or loose leaves, or as a concentrated extract of the chemical salvinorin A.

PERSON- any natural person, individual, corporation, unincorporated association, proprietorship, firm, partnership, joint venture, joint-stock association, or other entity or business organization of any kind.

March 22, 2011

Section 2. Prohibitions

Pursuant to Article 9 §2(C) 10 of the New York State Constitution governing protection, health, safety and well-being of persons, no person shall possess, sell or offer for sale *Salvia divinorum* within the Village of Spring Valley.

Section 3. Exceptions

The provisions of this law shall not apply to non prescription over-the counter drugs approved or regulated by the Federal Food and Drug Administration.

Section 4. Penalties

Any person who knowingly violates the provisions of this law shall be guilty of an unclassified misdemeanor punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000 and/or up to one year's imprisonment.

Section 5. Applicability

This law shall apply to all actions occurring on or after the effective date of this law.

Section 6. Reverse Presumption

This article shall be null and void on the day that statewide or federal legislation goes into effect incorporating either the same or substantially similar provisions as are contained in this article, or in the event that a pertinent state or federal administrative agency issue and promulgates regulations preempting such action by the Village of Spring Valley. The Village of Spring Valley may determine via mere resolution whether or not identical or substantially similar legislation has been enacted for the purposes of triggering the provisions of this section.

Section 7. Severability

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or other portion of this law is for any reason declared unconstitutional or invalid, in whole or in part, by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed severable, and such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect the remaining portions of this law, which shall continue in full force and effect.

SECTION 8. Effective Date

Unless otherwise specified, this local Law shall take effect upon filing with the office of the Secretary of State, pursuant to section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.
