Mayor Delhomme led the assembly in the salute to the flag.

Mayor's Report: *In the past twenty-five years I have come to know the Village of Spring Valley very well, and in 2000 I was elected as a Trustee. When I was elected in 1999 my goal was to move the Village forward and get things done. I have done many things as a community leader, but being the Mayor is a little bit different. Although when I was a Trustee I was the first person to contact Assemblyman Sam Coleman, and I brought cameras into the Village of Spring Valley, I also worked with Margret Jourdan one of the former Trustee to bring computers to the Civic Center. I also worked with the late Senator Moynihan to get the youth vans for the Village of Spring Valley. But when I became Mayor it is a whole different ball game. In the Village of Spring Valley we have a big tax problem, because of that it is more important to building business in the Village instead of houses. I made it my business to go around and try and bring good and healthy business to the Village, I am pro-business everybody knows that. We now have because of my doing through the Building Department, and Mr. Lynch involved in quite a few of them, thank you for sitting in that last meeting to try and bring things into the Village. I sometimes travel at night to meet with business to try and bring them into the Village. I am hoping as far as I know that there is going to be two hotels located in the Village of Spring Valley. Two not just one. The Village of Spring Valley is in a shortage of hotels because we are located in the hub of the County, Route 59, Route 45, and the thruway into the New York City four or five hotels would be fine for us because we are in the middle of the whole process. People going up north people going south, sometimes New York City is overcrowded and they have to go to New Jersey to have their special event and it is very expensive. Pretty soon we are going to have two hotels in the Village of Spring Valley that is the greatest thing ever taking place in history for the Village of Spring Valley, we have never had that. I hope the people out there know that is what the Mayor's job is, you go out and seek those types of things to bring into your community. We have estimated that those two hotels are going to bring estimates of 600 good paying jobs, and the tax that we are going to be generating from those hotels is going to help us to reduce your taxes in the Village of Spring Valley pretty soon. I have also met with other business to bring them into the Village of Spring Valley. I and one of the Building Inspectors traveled very far to meet with the particular business, and asked if they could look into coming here because this particular business is one of the best selling Spanish chicken in the world. If you look at the corner of Route 45 and 59 you see that there is a chicken place there and they are always busy. The Market Place that is located next door to the Village, when I took office it was shut down, so I reached out to the owner and asked him what he planned on doing with the building, he said that he didn't know. So 5 weeks into office I went to New York City and found this business and brought them to the Village of Spring Valley, and now we have a very nice market located right next door to Village Hall. I also brought God Father's Pizza also right next door to us, I negotiated for them to be in there. I have a friend of mine that talked to me they*

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wanted to bring the Caribbean, Haitian food to this community which is a franchise; they didn't know where to bring it. So we sat down and in six months, we now have La Baguette right next door. At the other end which used to be the Caribbean Village, which has now been closed for almost 10 years now. So I went to New York City and found a pharmaceutical company that is now going to be located in there. I have also meet with the developer that bought the old Key Bank, and he has agreed to develop that whole area and there are going to be new condominiums, we are in the process of working with him now to make sure they are not too high in the cost, and when I am ready with that one I will bring it to the Board of Trustees. One of the biggest things has happened to the Village of Spring Valley, a fortune 500 company is coming to the Village of Spring Valley. When I was down in North Carolina at one of the conference I attend, there were a lot of businesses there. One of the stores I saw it was almost like a neighborhood store, but they hired 100 people to work for them. So I sat down with them and negotiated with them and now where the old Garfunkels used to be on Main Street there will be a dollar general a multi-million dollar fortune 500 company located in the Village of Spring Valley. So we are going to have millions and millions of dollars coming into the Village pretty soon, so that way in the future will not have to raise the taxes

Youth & Recreation – Trustee White - *My report is the same one I had from the last meeting, what are we doing with the Kurtz Center? What are we doing for the youth? There is nothing, we don't have anybody that is in charge for any programs for the children, we don't have any programs going on the Kurtz Center, and I believe June 26th school is closed for the summer. So by this time we should have had some program ready for the children. So we need to sit down and discuss this so we have something in place by May 1st. Because school lets out June 26th.*

Fire & Safety – Trustee Grossman – *In light of the recent incident and tragedy that happened in New York City, with the seven children passing away in a fire. They found that there were no smoke detectors on the first floor and second floor where the people were residing and sleeping. Rockland County Health Department urges everyone to install smoke detectors, and those people that cannot afford their own smoke detectors and meet income guidelines, the Rockland County health Department has announced that they will donate and install the smoke detectors for them for free. Infrastructure – Deputy Mayor Leon - *Before I go on with my report, I would like to ask the Deputy Clerk if he received the documents that were requested two weeks ago, regarding the trip to Radio City Msuic Hall, and the Summer Camp. "The Deputy Clerk stated that he did not receive those records yet." So therefore Mayor two weeks have already passed and I want the record to state that. With that being said under the New York State General Municipal Law, article 4-4-12 paragraph 12 states that they give 30 days (inaudible) for those programs to be in.
